Find out more about toys from the past. Look at pictures of old and new toys and try to sort them. How can you tell that they are old/new?

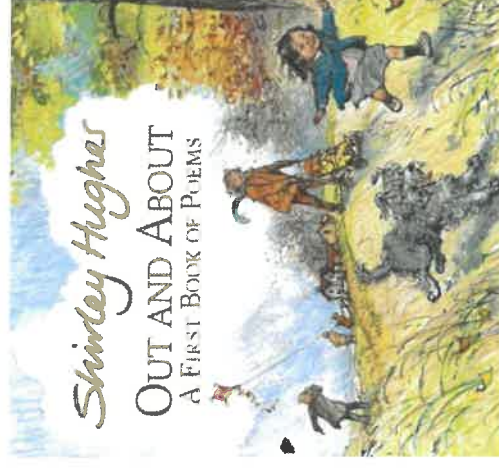
Read the story of Easter and find out why it is important to Christians. How do you and your family like to celebrate special occasions?

## Year 1 Home Learning – Spring 2

Our core story is:

### Out and About by Shirley Hughes

This is a collection of poems centred around being 'out and about' in different seasons.



On the VLE:

- Keep a daily blog on your homepage.
- Email a friend from your class.
- Use the painting tool on your homepage to draw your favourite season or a picture to go with your blog.

### Key English skills for your child:

Make a spring alphabet; A is for April, B is for Blossom, C is for...

Share books together. Talk about the characters and the main events. Draw your favourite character and describe them. Write a book review.

Read words containing or/au/aw e.g. fork, claw, autumn, August, ornament, straw.

Select a favourite poem and prepare a performance.

Create a list of adjectives that you already know and hunt for any new ones in books.

### Key Maths skills for your child:

Add and subtract 2 or 3 numbers together within 20, using +, - and = symbols to record their work. Draw a picture or count real objects if you need help to work out the answer.

Create number cards for the digits 0 – 10. Lay them all face down and pick one. How many more do you need to add to that number to total 10. You could play the same game up to 20.

Collect five different items of food. Can you guess which is heavier/lighter?
